The college basketball sets produced for *Bank Shot Basketball* are meant to be large swaths of college basketball history encompassing the legendary, good, the bad, and the ugly. Each set will feature teams that dominated the national landscape, featured college basketball's greatest players, fought hard for conference contention, competed to a near .500 record, or struggled to get to ten wins. For those gamers who want to play battles of all-time greats, you can, and for those gamers who want to pit their favorite teams against struggling teams so that you can run up the score, you can do that, too.

In **COLLEGE SET 01**, you get Christian Laettner, Bobby Hurley, and Grant Hill with the 1992 Duke Blue Devils; Michael Jordan, James Worthy, and Sam Perkins with the 1982 North Carolina Tar Heels; Bill Walton, Henry Bibby, and Jamaal Wilkes with the 1972 UCLA Bruins; and Jalen Brunson, Mikal Bridges, and Donte DiVincenzo with the 2018 Villanova Wildcats.

You will also get top-tier teams and players such Danny Manning and the 1988 Kansas Jayhawks; Magic Johnson and the 1979 Michigan State Spartans; Drew Timme, Corey Kispert, and Jalen Suggs and the 31-1 Gonzaga Bulldogs of 2021; Ben Gordon, Emeka Okafor, and Charlie Villanueva and the 2004 UCONN Huskies; the 34-1 UNLV Runnin' Rebels of 1991 featuring Larry Johnson, Stacey Augmon, and Anderson Hunt; Patrick Ewing and the 1984 Georgetown Hoyas; and two national champions, the 1986 Louisville Cardinals (Pervis Ellison) and the 2021 Baylor Bears (Davion Mitchell).

If you want to replay what was maybe the greatest game in college basketball history, you can, as Jamal Mashburn and the 1992 Kentucky Wildcats are included and ready to face Duke once again. The 1992 Indiana Hoosiers and Calbert Cheaney with Damon Bailey are ready to take on both teams, as they were the third best of these three Final Four teams in 1992 and were absolutely in contention for the title.

What team has been more storied than the 1990 Loyola Marymount Lions and their incredible tournament run featuring Bo Kimball's tributes to recently departed team member Hank Gathers? How far could they have gone with Gathers present? That's up to you.

Present in this set are the 1987 national finalist Syracuse Orangemen featuring Derrick Coleman, Sherman Douglas, and Rony Seikaly; and two players of the year – Luka Garza (2021 Iowa Hawkeyes) and Zach Edey (2023 Purdue Boilermakers). For Celtics fans, we also have Danny Ainge and his 1981 BYU Cougars team.

The 1984 Hoyas aren't without a rival, as Chris Mullin and the 1985 St. John's Redmen are included, as are the national champion 2006 Florida Gators featuring Joakim Noah, Corey Brewer, and Al Horford. In one of the greatest "should have been" stories in college basketball, the 1989 "Flyin' Illini" of Illinois are here.

Also included are the 1991 North Carolina Wolfpack (Chris Corchiani, Rodney Monroe, Tom Gugliotta), the 1970 LSU Tigers (Pete Maravich and his 44.5 PPG), the stellar defense of the 1991 Princeton Tigers (48.8 PPG Allowed), and the 1994 Wisconsin Badgers (Michael Finley, Rashard Griffith, Tracy Webster), a formidable contender in one of the Big 10's greatest seasons.

Rounding out a bottom of the pack is an interesting, high-scoring 1988 SIU Salukis team with a 0.9 points scored/allowed difference that can make them tough on any night, the 2007 Washington Huskies (Spencer Hawes, Jon Brockman), a poor 1992 SE Missouri State team who can go on a 3-pt run at any time, and maybe the worst team in college basketball history, the 1992 Prairie View Panthers.
