

Bank Shot Basketball will have yet another fun dive into college basketball history with **COLLEGE SET 06**. With teams that span from 1958 through 2023, this set adds 30 teams to your growing catalog of hoops history.

The two national champions in the set are 1975 UCLA and 2001 Duke. The 1975 season was John Wooden's final season and his final championship at UCLA. What a way to go out! With a 28-3 team consisting of seven players who would see the court in the pros, this was a deep team that included Dave Meyers, Richard Washington, and Marques Johnson. The 2001 Duke team was Coach K's third title winner. While the 1999 team [available in Set 02] may be Coach K's best (though it did not win a title), 2001 makes a strong case for his second-best unit. The team included Naismith College Player of the Year Shane Battier, Jay Williams, Mike Dunleavy, Carlos Boozer, and Chris Duhon.

Other Players of the Year in the set include David Robinson (1987 Navy) and his San Antonio teammate Tim Duncan (1997 Wake Forest), along with AP Player of the Year Denzel Valentine (2016 Michigan State). Robinson and Duncan were also the first picks in their respective NBA drafts.

Other notable college superstars in this set include: Elgin Baylor (1958 Seattle), Oscar Robertson (1960 Cincinnati), Jerry West (1960 West Virginia), Dan Issel (1970 Kentucky), Danny Ferry (1988 Duke), Bobby Phillips (1991 Southern), John Amaechi (1995 Penn State), A.J. Guyton (2002 Indiana), Richie Frahm & Matt Santangelo & Casey Calvary (2000 Gonzaga), Marcus Fizer (2000 Iowa State), Taylor Coppenrath & T.J. Sorrentine (2005 Vermont), Klay Thompson (2011 Washington State), Draymond Green (2012 Michigan State), Kris Joseph & Dion Waiters (2012 Syracuse), Malik Monk & De'Aaron Fox & Bam Adebayo (2017 Kentucky), Kyle Guy (2018 Virginia), Evan & Isaiah Mobley (2021 USC), Brandon Miller (2023 Alabama), and Trace Jackson-Davis & Jalen Hood-Schifino (2023 Indiana).

We have a few great sets of pro teammates here, including Baylor & West (LAL), Robinson & Duncan (SA), Thompson & Green (GS), and Monk & Fox (SAC). Trace Jackson-Davis is also a new teammate of Klay Thompson & Draymond Green. Two fascinating squads here are Scottie Pippin's 1987 Central Arkansas team (NAIA) and the 1972 Oral Roberts team that went 26-2 while averaging a scorching 105.1 points per game. Richard Fuqua led Oral Roberts with 35.9 points per game. Dan Issel had 33.9 for Kentucky, Oscar Robertson had 33.7 for Cincinnati, Elgin Baylor had 32.5 for Seattle, and Jerry West had 29.3 for West Virginia. For the record, 1991 Southern also averaged 104.4 points per game, while 1970 Kentucky averaged 96.8 PPG.

With this set, we also have now included every member of the 1992 Dream Team – in their collegiate years. If you have sets 01 through 06, you have the 1992 Dream Team on your tabletop.

The Cinderella here is the 15-seeded 2016 Middle Tennessee State team that upset the second-seeded Michigan State team (both are included here). The 2018 Virginia team is the top-seeded team that lost to 16-seeded UMBC, the first 16-over-1 upset in tournament history. That 16-seed UMBC team is in Set 04. The 2016 Yale team that defeated fifth-seeded Baylor is also here, and the 2010 Alcorn State squad (2-29) is our doormat for the set. With a -21.4 point differential, that's an early season win for most teams.
